Psalm 20: 1-9

Every day, even the blessed of the Lord will encounter a day of trouble. Sometimes it can be a week, months, or years. It comes to delay our focus, decrease our faith, and detour our future.

Although a righteous man, David experienced a day of trouble during the time of the text. Sometimes righteous people are abused by the wicked because no one has an immunization against trouble.

Throughout life, there are two kinds of trouble: expected and unexpected. We can prepare ourselves for expected trouble but the unexpected trouble is a different situation. Unexpected trouble comes when you least expect it and when you are least prepared for it. It comes like a thief in the night seeking to break our spirit, deplete our hope and steal our joy.

1. He Gives Us His Ear

Lord hear me, when you are in trouble, God will hear you if you talk to him. He gives attention to our affliction. God listens to our prayers.

2. God Gives Us His Name

There is power in the name of the Lord. When trouble arises and things just don't go your way, you've got to call on His name.

3. He Give Us His Shield

He covers us from all hurt harm and danger and protects us from all kinds of trouble.

4. He Sends Help From the Sanctuary

You've got to be careful how you handle yourself in the house because folk come in the sanctuary looking for help from the Lord.
