2021, The Year of Revival

Greetings in the name of He who orders our steps and directs our paths,

It warmed my heart to see so many of you in the church parking lot for Sunday worship on July 25. We know you are eager to return to the House of the Lord. I am pleased to share that we are now comfortable deeming **our Sunday, September 19 re-opening date concrete**. We look forward to worshipping together inside the church for the first time in nearly 19 months. This date was specifically selected to allow us to get through the better part of summer holiday gatherings and travel activities that typically bring large groups of people together. We remain in prayer for wisdom, guidance, and covering as we prepare for re-opening.

#YourSafetyMatters to us. That’s why we’re using a phased approach to our in-person return. We will hold Sunday worship services only when we initially return. We will monitor vaccination rates, local COVID-19 case numbers, and the health of the Salem congregation as we assess when and whether it is safe to begin incrementally returning each of our ministries to normal, day-to-day service.

In the meantime, we’re ensuring our staff and ministries are adequately prepared for the new normal environment. This past Saturday, July 31, we hosted refresher training sessions with our ministry leads and volunteers to make certain everyone is prepared to successfully carry out new normal, in-person procedures and protocols. Our first official dry run session will take place at the church **Sunday, August 15 at 10 a.m.** We will host several dry run sessions, capturing lessons learned and adjusting where needed. While you may start to see cars parked outside the church during these sessions, we would ask that you not come inside unless you are part of those sessions.

Vaccination Clinic Locations

We continue to monitor local public health conditions and watch positivity rates associated with mutated virus strains. Local and national public health officials have shared that the mutations are more contagious and impacting the health of the younger generation more prevalently than the earlier virus. We will continue to distribute communion elements on the first Saturday of every month even after we re-open for in-person worship. This will ensure that those who choose to worship virtually still have the opportunity to commune with us from home.


