IMA is an interdenominational fellowship of clergy, organized to support underserved African Americans
in metropolitan Omaha through action advocacy, and accountability.

The Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance Martin Luther King, Jr., Scholarship is awarded each year to an African American graduating high school senior who plans to enter an institution of higher education. This year the Alliance will award two \$1,000.00 scholarships. An eligible candidate must submit a complete application and be a member of a church in the Omaha, metropolitan area. The candidate must also graduate from high school in the 2023-2024 school year.

The award will be given to the institution of higher learning specified by the scholarship recipient upon written proof of the recipient's acceptance by the institution. The successful candidate will submit a complete **application** (pages below), an **essay** on the required topic related to Dr. King, a **current official high school transcript**, and a **pastor's letter** of recommendation. Recipients will be notified in writing by January 9, 2024, to attend the 40th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Luncheon on January 15. Awards will be announced during the luncheon.

The candidate should complete the application, print out the attached pages, then submit them with all other required documents (see below). Forms should be **typed**. Selection Process

A careful screening process ensures that each scholarship winner is qualified. The Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance Scholarship Committee will review all applications in search of the candidates who possess a good academic record, as well as those personal qualities that reflect significant overall potential for service to the larger community. All the following will be considered in determining the applicant's potential and personal motivation:

- Applicant's 400-word essay (pages 5-9)
- Pastor's letter of recommendation
- Church involvement (page 4)
- Community activity/service (page 4)
- Official grade point average (page 3) and official high school transcript
- Extra-curricular school activities and awards (page 4)

Applicants will also be judged on their package's overall neatness, timeliness, and presentation. Applicants are also strongly encouraged to take special care in preparing their essays. Please note that finalists may be required to submit to an interview.

- 1. Nonviolence is a way of life for courageous people. It is active nonviolent resistance to evil.
- 2. Nonviolence seeks to win friendship and understanding. The end result of nonviolence is redemption and reconciliation.
- 3. Nonviolence seeks to defeat injustice, not people. Nonviolence recognizes that evildoers are also victims.
- 4. Nonviolence holds that suffering can educate and transform. Nonviolence willingly accepts the consequences to its acts.
- 5. Nonviolence chooses love instead of hate. Nonviolence resists violence to the spirit as well as the body. Nonviolence love is active, not passive. Nonviolence love does not sink to the level of the hater. Love restores community and resists injustice. Nonviolence recognizes the fact that all life is interrelated.
- 6. Nonviolence believes that the universe is on the side of justice. The nonviolent resister has deep faith that justice will eventually win.
